Clearpoint is a bilingual community school where the partnership and respect of its members are valued. Parents, community members and staff work together to provide the best possible learning environment for every student. The result is that Clearpoint is a school where there is a sense of family and a pride in belonging.

SCHOOL PROFILE

School Profile

Clearpoint Elementary IB World School is located in Pointe-Claire South, a borough of Montreal, Quebec, Canada. It is located within the territory of the Lester B. Pearson school board. The school's population is comprised of families who are predominantly middle to higher socioeconomic status. The population is currently 441 students. The school attracts a sizable population of international students who stay for varying periods of time due to citizenship requirements, as well as parents' employment contracts and opportunities for post-secondary study. Clearpoint employs approximately 70 – 80 staff members that includes administration, teachers, support staff and daycare educators.

Clearpoint Elementary IB World School offers an English K4 program and a bilingual program from K5 to sixth grade serving families primarily from the Pointe-Claire area, along with neighbouring boroughs. We offer the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) leading our students in the inquiry approach to learning. The PYP is based on inquiry into six transdisciplinary themes: Who We Are, Where We Are In Place And Time, How We Express Ourselves, How The World Works, How We Organize Ourselves and Sharing The Planet. Staff and students celebrate attributes that make up globally-minded students who take action. Families and community members contribute actively to units of inquiry through volunteering, lending of materials, guest presentations and partnerships.

Our aim is to foster internationally-minded students who take initiative and action in making our world a better place. Students benefit from exposure to the arts in the form of dance and music, as well as 2 - 60 minute physical education periods per week. The school's technology plan offers iPads in the younger grades, as well as a 1:1 device plan from grades 2-6. Students are provided with the opportunity to enroll in extra-curricular activities, which include Spanish, Mandarin as well as various lunchtime and after school activities and intra-murals.

Clearpoint currently has a partnership with the Lac Saint Louis CLSC which assigns a nurse and a social worker. Services are also provided to Clearpoint by a school board organization called the FSSTT (Family School Support and Treatment Team). There is a FSSTT support technician, art therapist and liaison person all assigned to the school. The students benefit from a range of other services provided by the school board that includes: a psychologist, a speech therapist, an occupational therapist and consultants who support academics as well as special needs students. These services are available on an as-needed basis.

Clearpoint also maintains close collaborative relationships with the two main English language universities in Montreal - Concordia, and McGill - through the acceptance of student teachers who regularly complete internship placements with our classroom teachers. The high demand for internships at Clearpoint is a clear indication of the strong reputation for professional and pedagogical rigour that our teachers have developed.

GIMAC (Girls In Motion At Clearpoint) is an initiative that started at Clearpoint to provide girls to challenge themselves both mentally and physically in response to the inequity that many of their gender have to face. This initiative which involves the participation of girls from grades four to six along with staff mentors enable the students and their guardians to celebrate being a girl through a day filled with activities that promote camaraderie, fitness, learning and love. As we enter the current school year, we are planning for the 8th annual GIMAC conference, each of which has featured key-note speakers, special workshops, and most importantly an opportunity to experience creativity, empowerment and development of individual, personal goals and a vision for the future.

Collaboration between the school and the learning community (parents, volunteers, community members) is a notable area of strength at Clearpoint. The impact of this collaboration has resulted in a positive relationship between students, staff and parents. The benefits of this relationship include:

- Our recently-renovated, volunteer-run library overseen by our library technician.
- Our active Home and School Association who provide fundraising activities as well as significant financial support to the school. They also contribute time and family-based community level activities.
- Parents contribute to units of inquiry through a variety of presentations as guest speakers, and support field trip opportunities when appropriate.
- Former parents continue to volunteer in the school once their own children have graduated as Mentors for exhibition or as leaders of clubs and committees.
- Partnerships between the local SPVM and the City have resulted in learning opportunities for the students. These include: composting, local library activities and visits, Police officer presentations, Stewart Hall field trips and workshops.

As noted, we seek to develop core values in our students of a commitment to life-long learning, and the acceptance of others. The Learner Profile of the IB, helps to define what the students of Clearpoint IB World school strive to be:
