**Principal: Rachel Wilson**

- Feb. 10 was the Curiosity Assembly presented by the grade 4 classes. Amazing job!
- Feb. 19<sup>th</sup> – Grade 6 Exhibition – All GB members should have received an invitation. 3-6pm. Students of grades 3-5 will be visiting the Exhibition on Wednesday afternoon as dress rehearsal. The grade 6 students will be going around to the K-2 classes the day prior to present their Exhibitions.
- Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> – GIMAC 1-4 Guest speaker: Emily Silver, US silver medalist swimmer, is the keynote speaker, Jeff Waters Teaching basic self-defence principles, JRHS leadership students doing a workshop on trust/ice breakers, Sue Connery talking about safety on the Internet, Steve Wilson shooting daughters with parents, Anne Papyotti leading an intro to Zumba segment. Donations are coming in for raffle prizes and food.
- Feb. 23-27<sup>th</sup> is Carnival Week – Beach Bonanza email should be going out this weekend. The Button contest was launched.

March 12<sup>th</sup> – Jump rope for Heart – Great activity to focus on our community. There will be pledges. More info to come.

**Teachers: Bill Mang:**

- Jungle Sport was a big success – 9<sup>th</sup> year having them come to our school. Family night was very popular and a discussion to have 2 nights next year was brought up. Cost and time were the main issues but would be looked into.

-32 Grade 5 students travelled to McGill University to participate in a wide variety of basketball drills and games. The students were divided into smaller groups and mixed with students from other schools. McGill University Physical Education students instructed the activities and their aim was to introduce the skills of the game for participants to experience fun and challenging drills and play in simple games.

-Outdoor skating at Clearpoint Park started this week.

-Lunch-time basketball is almost done.

-Attended a 2-day Leadership Conference with Rachel and Diana. Was very informative.

-Sandra will be taking her 4/5 class to Stewart Hall to visit the Art Gallery.

**Daycare: Tassie Fyon**

2 Ped days since last GB meeting:

-January 19<sup>th</sup> the children did an art activity – made snowmen out of socks and stuffing.

-February 6<sup>th</sup> – Youth Stars Foundation was in for the day. From 9am-4pm they provided 3 activities – dance, karate and sports. Then students were divided into 3 groups and rotated through the 3 activities both in the morning and again in the afternoon. At the end of the day, the students all had a chance to perform their dance routines that they had learned.

Tax receipts – Tassie is in the midst of preparing tax receipts for both Daycare and lunch – these will be handed out the last week of February.

**Home & School: Marie-Flore Gignac-Dube**

**Commissioner: Wayne Clifford**

At its December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2014 and January 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015 meetings, the Council of Commissioners:

- Decided to delay the adoption of a new policy governing Home Schooling to allow for further input from representatives of the home schooling community.
- Adopted the School Enrolment Criteria for 2015-2016 which are essentially unchanged from 2014-2015.
- Received the audited LBPSB Financial Statements for 2013-2014. These can be found on the board website at:

- Launched the 2015-2016 Budget Priorities Consultation.
- Authorized an increase of 3% in the price schedule for the 2015-2016 rental of school facilities. The objective is to break-even on this service to community groups and generally still leaves the LBPSB's rates lower than other offered by similar organizations (school boards, cegeps, municipalities).
- Approved a mandate for the board's new Communications and Innovation Committee which includes exploring the "appropriate use of technology and new innovative marketing and communication approaches" and making "recommendations... so that technology is used to its full potential to ensure effective, current and informative messaging".
- Received a report on school library services from the student commissioners indicating that LBPSB (especially high school) students would like greater access provided to digital books and also more space for individual study in the libraries.

The Quebec Minister of Education visited the LBPSB in January and indicated that, although none of the anticipated school board merger plans are expected to involve our board, major changes to the overall governance of school boards in the province could be expected to be announced in the near future.

The next regular meeting of the Council of Commissioners is scheduled for Monday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:30 pm. and, as are all council meetings, will be webcast via the board website.

-Transportation meeting discussed having an App built so parents could locate where their child's school bus is on the road in hopes to have them outside in the cold for a shorter amount of time.
