1. Welcome:

- 2. Approval of the Agenda: Motion to approve by Mme. Suzanne and seconded by Laura.
- 3. Approval of Minutes from September 6th, 2023: Motion to approve minutes (with correction to add Ms. Tassie as attending) by Ms. Tassie and seconded by Rean.









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- 4. Public & Member Question Period:
 - There will not be a cycle 3 teacher representative on GB this year.
 - In the past parents have been able to order Clearpoint Sweatshirts and T-shirts, which match
 the students' shirts for the year Ms. Pan will look into making this available this year for
 parents.
 - Reminder that the student should wear their yearly Clearpoint shirts on Field Trips to make it easy to locate our students.
 - If there is a digit version of the workbook, will the parents be given access to login information, so they can utilize it to it's full potential? This is at teachers' discretion, but many logins will be going out soon, it takes time for teachers to prepare. Digital items are helpful and parents also like physical copies too, parents just want resources to practice at home.

 - 5.1. Selection of chairperson and secretary:
 - Dominique Bensadoun was voted in as our chairperson for this year, the secretary position will be filled by Rebecca-Ann Belmonte and has Amanda Blackburn as a replacement.

- 6. New Business
 - 6.1. GIMAC, May 25, 2024
 - Girls in Motion at Clearpoint is done every second year alternating with Boy'R'Us and is a day of action for the students taking place on Saturday, May 25 from 9 am to 3pm.
 - For student in Grade 4 6. 4 teachers and staff members will be running the event.
 - Cost is \$20/ child and \$45/adult. Costs cover: snack, pizza lunch, T-shirt and come of speakers and presenters.
 - Something to think about for next year: should be only include grade 5- 6 so that when they alternate (one year for girls, one for boys) all the students will have an equal time to participate.









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6.2. Legados Spanish Classes:

- We are going to try to get this class up and running this year, with the help of Home & School developing Spanish Class extra curricular activity.
- 6.3. Schools Taking Root Fundraiser: Is for October 20th at 2:30 to 5:30 pm.
 - Deadline to order extended to October 13, we need a minimum of 60 baskets, currently only sold 32.

7. Field Trips, Fundraisers & Activities

7.1. LBPSB Volleyball Tournament:

• Grade 6 student, on January 9th, 2024. Costs about \$800, about 40 kids will attend. Looking into renting a city bus. We are asking for parent volunteers so the ration will be 1:8.

7.2. Stewart Hall

- Cycle 2 Students will be walking to Stewart Hall, 2 classes at a time.
- This is a free activity, and a great bonding experience for the kids. We will be inviting parent volunteers.

7.3. K's Field Trip:

- Eco-Museum on November 2 (1:5 ratio) leaving at 8:20 am
- Walking to see how animals prepare for winter. May have snack but back for lunch. Ms. Pan says there is funding 30\$/child by government, will use half so it will cost parents \$15.

7.4. TCBY Grad Fundraiser:

- Order form will be sent out to parents, \$55.25 for the year.
- TCBY has 2 flavors, both of which are nut free, chocolate/vanilla swirl, or watermelon which is dairy free.
- Grads will manage distribution on Thursdays.
- Grads can make about \$6,000 from this fundraiser.

7.5. Halloween Dance:

- October 27, there will be a junior dance, followed by a senior dance. Suggesting a \$3 donation.
- We will be selling food items, and Home & School requesting parents sign up to donate food (needs to be nut free).

7.6. Pearson Education Foundation (PEF):

- Winter clothing program if any of the Clearpoint staff know that a child does not have proper winter attire, the school communicates with PEF, and they will come fast, and matches the students wishes.
- They buy directly form suppliers, so nothing is second hand.
- Child's dignity is preserved, and needs are met, with brand new winter clothing. They are excellent and accommodating students wishes.
- Due to covid their donators have dwindled, so we would like to raise money in November. Helping hand is available for field trips so no students are left behind.

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8. Reports

8.1. Principal:

- Balloon Parade went well, and we even made the Gazette's front page.
- Terry Fox run went well, thanks Ms. Eccles and Ms. Yates.
- The Corn Roast was a great way to welcome everyone back and kick off the school year.
- Kindergarten students were able to get their vision screened.
- On National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, we had Sam Ojeda and his wife Mme. Veronique made a special presentation.
- Only 20 students were absent on Attestation Day.
- We will be doing fire drills and lockdown drills for emergency preparedness.
- IEP day was September 22.

8.2. Teachers

- K4-K5: Mme. Suzanne working on schools and responsibilities and roles in schools, and schools around the world. We will be doing an outdoor classroom for the morning.
- Cycle 1: Ms. Dahlia, working on community unit, sent photos of community-based activities, strong sense of belonging, pictures in hallways and presented on smart boards. This week they will interview each other – based on attributes making friendship bracelets. Each attribute will be a different colour.
- Cycle 3: looking at government how we organize ourselves, grade 5 Canadian government grade 6 governments around the world.
- Music: huge shoutout to school for learning OCEAN for truth and reconciliation assembly, working on Halloween song and rhythms. Cycle 3 working on choose or compose song and create a dance to prepare for the class, doing presentation on artist of their song. Preparing for holiday concert.
- Phys ed: Doing team sports with Grade 5 and 6 at lunch. Working on football now. There has been some conflict between years younger vs older. Grade 5-6 intermural, try to get different grade captains, and learning how to work together. Grade 3-4 soccer unit. Starting ultimate frisbee hopefully get into schoolboard competition next year.
- Cross country run next week at the Morgan Arboretum, we've been practicing in class and at lunch. Need winter or rain boots and running shoes in bag. Dress in layers, have nametag, grade 6 run first, finish with grade 4.
- Thank you to everyone who donated to Terry Fox, almost \$12,000 was raised, goal was \$8,000.
- Resource groups commenced this week, with continued highlight on literacy intervention, done training Ufly, a scientific backed approach to teaching literacy.

8.3. Primary Years Program (PYP) Update:

• Finishing first unit of inquiry, parent letter will go home about their next unit of inquiry. We are seeing actions outside of the school, and students are having fun being in the newsletter. First school assembly will be in November.









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8.4. Daycare

- We've been spending a lot of time outside with September's warm weather.
- Started beading, corking, making turkeys, and lots of other crafts.
- We had attestation week for daycare. Thanks to parents for bringing their kids. Government will give another 2 weeks during the year.
- 228 registered for daycare full to the max. 10 classes and everything is going smoothly.
- Still looking for staff at lunch time. Integration aides have been helping.

8.5. Home & School:

- Lunchtime activities opened more spaces for yage and cabaret kids. Everything else is sold out. Coding is still available.
- Pizza lunch went well. Pasta seems to be popular hopefully it will proceed all year, 170 students signed up. Testing to see how we will handle leftovers.
- Halloween Dance on October 27, separated by grade levels. Drinks and snacks will be sold by Home & School and Grad committee. Parents will have to register 1 parent per family.
- In November, there will be an in-person Scholastic book fair.
- Thank you to staff for submitting teacher allocations.
- Holiday fair started planning for December 2nd.
- 8.6. LBPSB PC Rep Presented by Dominique (on behalf of Marc who was absent):
 - The last meeting was an AGA, and there was voting for a new slate of parent committee members.
 - SNACC Specials needs advisory committee. Needs to be parents with kids that have special needs these members do not have to part of governing board. They are a self-governed group, and for the first time, was not able to elect new members.

8.7. Commissioner

Marilyne was not able to attend this meeting.

9. Varia:

- Last year at the end of year Mr. Estok talked about a new playground structure meeting with outdoor committee and will talk about a government grant. Meeting with committee and home and school put aside down payment. This is still on our radar.
- Updates on Library time. The librarian has agreed to try to have parent volunteers on Wednesday's
 that she is here. The parents will be checking out the books which the librarian reads to a second
 group of students. Librarian is not allowed to train volunteers. The ultimate goal is for the library to
 be used at max capacity, and this allows for double the capacity that we currently have. This still
 needs to be approved by the librarian and council. We need to be very contentious since the union
 is still fighting for librarians.
- Lockdown Drill We will do this as calmly as possible to prepare kids. We've explained that these
 can be needed if there is a medical emergency and hallways need to be cleared, or if an
 unexpected person comes to the school.
