Principal

Events:

Each one shared and demonstrated their expertise to our students. Our grade 6 students all commented on how the presentations were both inspirational and thought-provoking giving them many ideas for their project topics. IB - Primary Years Program

Exhibition is well underway for the grade 6 students. They are in the research/writing phase of their exhibition project, having each determined two key concept questions for their project.

Many students, across the grades, participated in the self-management activity and sent in their "one-word" target for the new year. We will be hanging these in the halls so students can see the power of one word and how many different powerful words there are!

Kindergarten – K4

Our K4 students have just finished their unit on "How to express ourselves". They worked on their "This is not a box" projects and presented them to their friends. They will be starting their final unit shortly and we are looking forward to it. The parent component for Jan and Feb went very well, it was wonderful having the parents visit our classroom.

Kindergarten – K5

The kindergarten students are working on the Lunar New Year in both English and French classes. We will be celebrating Valentine's Day on Wednesday and Thursday with special moments for the children. We are also working on the winter component of our Seasons unit. What we wear, how plants adapt, different winter sports and the animals in our environment.









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Cycle 1

Cycle One has decided to tackle 2 interconnected units of inquiry at the same time. In English, we have started our 'Sharing the Planet' unit of inquiry. The children are learning about the characteristics of living things. Most of the unit pertains to life cycles. Children will learn specifically about the life cycle of plants, turtles, seahorses, penguins, bees and butterflies.

On February 22nd, we are fortunate to have 'Insectambulant Groupe' present to our grades 1 and 2 classes in school. This organization brings live and some preserved bug insect specimens. The children get the opportunity to be entomologists for the day! They will even be given a chance to hold a real-life tarantula and stick bug!

In French, cycle one has begun the 'How the World Works' unit of inquiry. They will explore the changing properties of water. They are learning about the water cycle. Lots of fun and exploratory experiments are in store for them!

Cycle 2

The students continue to work on the Space unit. The grade 4s are researching the different topics and will be presenting their projects to their peers. Grades 3 and 4 went to the Cosmodôme on a field trip on January 17 and 18. They could answer many questions they had learned in their unit. We had two guest speakers (parents of students in grade 3) come and share their knowledge on space exploration.

Cycle 3

In Grade 5, They are working on the IB unit "How to Express Ourselves" through various styles of Art. In English, they are starting the IB unit "Where We Are in Place and Time." They will be working on different aspects of the community with a hopeful visit to City Hall. Students have been working on their exhibition projects developing self-management skills as they research and answer their key concept questions. Also, Grade 6 students met with their mentors for the first time last week at lunch and were explained what mentors are.
