Reports – January 2024

8.1 Principal

New Ministry Allocation: Due to the strike actions before the holidays, the Ministry has given the school an allocation for tutoring. For LBPSB, we were given each a sum of \$11,600. This tutoring plan is intended to give an academic boost to students who are on the cusp of passing. Clearpoint will therefore be offering approximately 45 pre-selected students one hour after school for 10 weeks. We also received an allocation that allows us to get more aide time.

Events: February was a busy month despite it being the shortest month of the year. Throughout the month of Black History, the students were treated to special BHM events. Weekly, Sarah Zaslov, our spiritual animator highlighted an important BH figure or story to share with the students. Among other activities that Sarah and the teacher did, there will be a presentation from the Overture with the Arts, "Tracking Black Canada" on Wednesday, February 21st. Sarah then officially closed BHM with a full school virtual assembly on February 28th, where we showcased all the BHM activities that were done at Clearpoint. Although BHM comes to a close, our commitment to social equity, inclusively, and justice will continue well past February.

Also in February, we had Pink Shirt Day on the 28th. Along with a Pink T-shirt and water bottle fundraiser, H&S generously helped pay for the presenter Amen Iseghohi who came to speak to all our students about anti-bullying and kindness on this day.

H&S also hosted our Annual Comedy Night, a delightful event for staff and parents who attended.

A big thank you once again goes out to H&S for providing coffee and treats to our staff not once but twice this month. Your kindness and generosity have not gone unnoticed. Thank you!

As well, all students from Grades 4 to 6 participated in the annual Our School Survey which targeted topics such as bullying, belonging, and social well-being while at school. The results were shared with the staff and will also be shared with students and Governing Board members.

8.2 Teachers

Kindergarten - K4

We have been busy in K4! We hosted our February parent component "sledding with family and friends" and it was a wonderful event for all. The children had a wonderful time with their classmates, parents and teachers. We have also started our final unit "Sharing the Planet" and we are looking forward to some yummy healthy activities shortly! We are also planning a field trip for April in conjunction with our unit.

Kindergarten - K5

The kindergarten students are busy, busy! We are learning about Ramadan and St-Patrick's Day which is another way "How we express ourselves through celebrations". We are looking to see if the geese are coming home which is a sign of Spring. We have heard them and seen them flying overhead. We are finishing the Winter component of our Seasons unit. We continue to work on letter-sound associations in both English and French as well as sight words in English.

Cycle 1

Physical Education:

We are concluding our winter activities with Senior Ski Day this week. We are starting our 3-week basketball unit with all grades. The Tuesday/Wednesday intramurals at lunchtime will continue with Basketball for grades 5 and 6. The next class unit will be a new sport at Clearpoint called Tchoukball for cycles 2 and 3.

8.3 IB - Primary Years Program

The IB mentoring program is continuing, preparing the Grade 6 students for their Exhibition project. They have completed the Ask Questions stage and are working on the Take Action stage. The projects will be presented at Exhibition Night on April 18th.

8.4 Daycare

Grade 1 - Miss Maryam:

In grade one daycare this month we started our first week talking about our spring break, what everyone did and how they spent their time. We also discussed the time change and as the weather is getting warmer, we will spend more time doing outdoor activities like soccer and basketball. We made CD spinners and everyone made their design. The children were super happy and proud of them. As spring approaches and the Persian New Year is coming on March 20, 1 will read to the kids the story about Nowruz and the Persian New Year, finishing with the end of March Easter activities.

Grade 103 & 203 - Miss Irma

My class is working to enhance the taste of the books and having a 5-minute silent reading every day. Also, we came back to work with corking to enhance the fine motricity.

Grade 202-303 are dancing every Monday to improve coordination, balance and strength in a fun way. They also are doing Yoga to develop motor skills, flexibility and attention as well as St Patrick's art and craft.

Grade 2 - Miss April









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This week we made our "Passports" because we will do a little "travelling" to a few different countries. In each stop, we'll learn some facts about the country, and the country's flag, as well as do a craft or possibly make a food dish related to that country. We're going to start with Ireland and St Patrick's Day leprechauns this week with a craft and a fun little activity.

Grade 3 - Miss Pam

Our class has been growing, learning and having fun through activities such as making slime, practicing music (ie Eye of the Tiger), organizing hockey tournaments, watching short episodes of Natgeo for kids, optical illusion crafts, chess games, twister. Learning to solve their problems, strengthen friendships and learning to be respectful and polite.

Grade 5 - Miss Kim

This month the children will be working on a St Patrick's Day activity to celebrate the holiday which is to build a leprechaun trap using different materials. We will then start working on an Easter craft. As well we will also begin talking about the growth cycle of plants and will be planting seeds as well as discussing the requirements of certain plants or food to grow in different climates and conditions.
