Cycle 1 Cycle 1 is wrapping up our unit on Landforms. Lots of discussion today about Iceland's volcanic eruption that took place yesterday. Fun reading week activities. Grade 2 wrote their own adventure stories and designed their own book covers. Over the next few days, students are busy preparing for Portfolio night. They are carefully organizing their work and deciding which pieces to select to put into portfolio binders.

Cycle 2 Cycle 2 closed their units on Money and Music. We have begun our next unit on Poetry, the students really seem to be enjoying it. Grade 3 students built ugly sticks; an instrument made of recycled material that is native to Newfoundland. We use them in our music unit, and we have used them a little bit in our poetry unit as well.

Cycle 3 Grade 6: Working on the unit Who we are. Looking into the 5 major religions of the world.
